Cycle to school week










In year 2 we have started our first art unit where the children are learning all about 'sketching'. The children explored creating tone and shade using different pencil pressures and pencil grips.










This week, Year 4 learned about the human digestive system by enjoying a fun (and messy!) experiment in which we recreated the digestion process in the classroom using biscuits, orange juice, a banana and a pair of tights. The demonstration helped children to visualise the process of digestion in a practical way. Their learning was then tested with a quiz on mini whiteboards. I think the children would agree that it was a memorable science lesson!













This week, Year One embarked on an exciting journey into our new science unit, "Animals Including Humans" focusing on the fascinating world of our five senses! The children engaged in a variety of hands-on activities to explore how we perceive the world around us. They used their sense of smell to compare and contrast different scents, enhancing their descriptive skills. In our "Curiosity Cuboid," students utilised their sight to investigate

new concepts, sparking their natural curiosity. To explore touch, the children felt various objects, learning to articulate how each one feels. They sharpened their listening skills by carefully identifying different sounds, turning sound recognition into a fun guessing game. Lastly, the children tasted fruit and were invited to share their thoughts on the flavors they experienced.
