PTFA Events



Year 5 have embraced the different rounds they have learnt to sing and accompany with Miss Renouf over the last few weeks. What great harmonies you have made. Wow.






The Year 3 Recorder group enjoyed learning a new note today and are working hard at preparing a piece for our music assembly in the next few weeks.

The Year 4 children had great fun celebrating National Poetry Day and writing their own poems on the theme of counting. We were so impressed by the inspiring poetry the children composed!

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
