

Land	A part of the earth's surface not covered by water (urban/residential, agricultural)	
Sea	An expanse of salt water which covers (71%) most of the earth's surface.	
Island	A piece of land (smaller than a continent) surrounded by water.	
United Kingdom	It is a unique country made up of four nations: England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland . England, Wales, and Scotland also make up Great Britain.	
Location	The place where something is.	
Maps	A map is an image of an area, taken from above, maps tell us the location of different places	
Aerial view	To look at something from above.	
Hill	A hill is a landform that is higher than the surrounding land and that is smaller than a mountain.	
Road	A long narrow smooth course for people or vehicles to travel on.	
Park	An area of land for rest and enjoyment	
City	A place people live and work which is larger than a town.	
Vale	A valley – a long ditch in the earth's surface, that often lies between ranges of hills or mountains.
