## Welcome from Mr Lewis-Cole

Welcome back after, what I hope was, a relaxing and enjoyable half term break. Talking to some families and staff, it would seem that lots of us have been poorly with this rather nasty cold that has been going around. If this was you, I do hope that you are now feeling much better.

### Safer Journeys to School

We have partnered with the local authority to run the 'Safer Journeys to Schools' programme which will begin on 10th March. This is a 4 week programme which looks to improve the conditions outside of the school at the beginning and end of the day. I will be sending more information out about this shortly.

### My Child at School

As I previously mentioned, we are very excited to be moving to a new application for school communications. This will be a 'one-stop shop' for everything that we need in order to receive information from school, order dinners, make online payments, booking parents' evenings and booking your child onto clubs. What we really like about this new application is that information can be shared with both parents and will come to you through a downloadable APP (MCAS). This means that all the information you need will be found in one place. Equally, this application allows you to update your information (e.g. phone number or address) and get 'real time' information about your child's attendance and assessment.

We have put together a clear roll out programme for the introduction of this application which will start soon. As part of this, we will be gradually moving onto this new application (MCAS) from 'Teachers2Parents' and 'School Money' and will keep you updated about this progress, including key dates.

### **World Book Day**

Excitement is building for World Book Day next Thursday 3rd March. This is always an event in school that is enjoyed by all. 

# are musicians

This week our Year 3 flautists, performed bravely in the music assembly. We were impressed with your rhythm and bravery. A challenge has been set to play again at the end of term with a louder tone. Great performing.





Today in our music assembly we practiced a song all about kindness as that has been a theme for this week. We will be singing in our whole school assembly on Friday. Our assembly was smaller in numbers today, but you all made a great musical sound.

Today was the first lesson of music for Year 3. They were excited to get on board the music bus and have their first rhythm and beat lesson. The children successfully used notation to play through a selection of rhythm patterns. They also had some success in performing a rhythm against a different rhythm.





Our orchestra were delighted to meet today today to make music after the half term's break. They played through a range of pieces and enjoyed a improving our newest most challenging piece.

# Together we

This week, the children from Year 5 performed their Viking songs which they have been working on in their musical study, 'We are composers'. We were so impressed with their focus, their musical participation and their compositions skills in making up rhythms and melodies. They enjoyed selecting their favourite Viking warm up song to sing for the last time.











This week in science, children in Year 5 have been experimenting with levers and pulleys. In class, they have made their own catapult using levers. The children used their understanding of how levers help us to use a small amount of force can result in a larger force.


## love to learn

This week, Year 6 had a great day out and about in Plymouth consolidating their history learning form their World War Two topic this half term. The children spent time in The Box where they looked at the bomb map of Plymouth which showed where and just how many bombs were dropped on the city during the Plymouth Blitz. As well as this, they were able to see the impact the war had on the city as a whole and just how far it has come in being rebuilt over the years. From The Box, we explored different areas of the city which were impacted and left behind during the war including: Charles Cross Church, Portland Square Memorial, the clock tower near the Theatre Royal and the war memorial on Plymouth Hoe. Everyone had a great day, walked many many many steps and learnt a lot!









### **WHO WE ARE**

Plymouth Hygiene Hub is a new joint social action project between: Transforming Plymouth Together, Peninsular Dental Social Enterprise and a number of local churches.

### WHAT WE DO

We provide low cost hygiene products and basic dental health advice to families in need.

No referral is required.

### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

Parents and carers can sign up for an annual membership of £1.50 New members get a free dental kit with toothpaste and toothbrushes. After that, members can return every 6-8 weeks, and receive further supplies for a modest contribution.

Looking ahead, we hope to introduce more low cost hygiene products, but for now we are focussing on dental health.
